

2017-2018 GRANTS & GIVING REPORT

ACCESS TO HEALTHCARE:

Austin College to continue to fund the Social Entrepreneurship for Poverty Alleviation (SEPA) program to increase Austin College student engagement and collaboration with local nonprofit organizations.

Big Five Community Services Inc. to provide transportation to medical appointments to individuals who do not currently have access to transportation to meet their medical needs.

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) to continue to recruit and train new volunteer advocates who provide a voice for children as well as support supervision of current volunteers with case investigations and court advocacy duties including the provision of ongoing training through state and national seminars.

Child & Family Guidance Center to provide access to high quality mental healthcare to children and families living in poverty and address the mental healthcare workforce shortage.

Divine Equine Therapeutic Riding Center to provide Disabled Veterans with Equine-Assisted Activities and Therapies (EEAT) where therapeutic riding classes are focused on enhancing physical, cognitive, emotional and/or social skills.

Family Promise to provide transitional shelter in a clean, safe environment with education, meals, care and counseling for homeless families with children while they attain sustainable housing and meaningful employment.

Fannin County Children's Center to increase access to specialized medical exams and mental health services for victims of child abuse and provide children in foster care with a trained volunteer advocate along with child abuse prevention training for adults.

Fannin Health Clinic to fund medicine, lab work and x-rays for patients along with clinic utilities, telephones and supplies.

Fannin Pregnancy Care Center to update the curriculum for the Stepping Stones Motherhood Program which provides ongoing education enabling young women in crisis pregnancy to make good choices in raising their children and becoming financially independent.

Four Rivers Outreach – Dental Clinic to provide free dental care to low-income individuals who do not have dental insurance.

Four Rivers Outreach – Life Recovery Program to provide a Residential Recovery Program for men and a Non-Residential Recovery Program for men and women to help them overcome their addictions and build an independent life free of drugs and alcohol.

Girls on the Run of Southern Oklahoma to provide program funding for character building education and training for a 5K event for girls in 3rd through 8th grade.

Grayson College Foundation – Radiologic Technician Program to maintain the Radiologic Technician Program accreditation by replacing old film analog equipment with the required digital imaging technology.

Grayson County Health Clinic to fund a clinic remodel/expansion along with funding to expand healthcare services that are not currently covered by the Indigent Healthcare Program.

Greater Texoma Health Clinic to offset provider salaries along with support for equipment, medical supplies, electronic medical records, and ancillary services.

Home Hospice Application - Camp Dragonfly to support Camp Dragonfly for grieving children and Family Grief camps for the entire family.

Home Hospice of Grayson County - Charity Care to support the charity care program for those without insurance and those who do not qualify for Medicaid or Medicare eligibility.

Mental Health Services of Southern Oklahoma to increase access to mental health care and shorten wait times for persons experiencing a crisis through the FaceTime iPad program.

New Life House to support general operating expenses as well as equipment needs for the sober living home for women.

NEWCO (Helping Hands) to support the Texoma Behavioral Health Leadership Team (TBHLT) with a community health needs assessment, an administrative assistant and the second annual Behavioral Health Conference.

Oklahoma Dental Foundation to purchase a new MobileSmiles vehicle to deliver professional dental care directly to those in need.

Southwestern Diabetic Foundation (Camp Sweeney) to provide a three-week residential diabetic life skills training program for children ages 5 to 19.

Your Health Clinic (Callie Clinic) to improve access to behavioral/mental health services for uninsured males who are HIV-positive.

HEALTH PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION (INCREASE IN NURSING):

Grayson College Application -Nursing to support nursing faculty to increase the number of registered nurses working in the service area and develop and retain the nursing workforce.

Grayson County Women's Crisis Center (SANE) to provide funds for continuous support of the Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) program.

Southeastern Foundation – ECU to support the nursing program in Durant by providing a quality BSN program for the area.
